**Born in Pakistan and now based in Blackburn,** Halima Cassell is currently making waves in the international art world.

Halima's sculpture work is a beautiful combination of organic shapes, structured with architectural precision. She uses complex surface patterns and contours to create vivid movement and fluidity in her work.

Sculptures can be found in the V&A, Manchester Art Gallery, The RCA, and a number of private collections.







**Working with Graham & Brown studio,** Halima has developed 5 paintable textured wallpapers.



During development Halima kept to the same methodology as her sculpture work, developing sketches of repeating geometrics to mathematical accuracy, and then working tirelessly on the arrangement and layering of textures and depth to give the work life.
